The Inland Chess Academy's curriculum is built on proven methods developed by the United States Chess Federation (USCF), Russian Chess School, Chess Magnet School, and presented by our experienced coaching staff.

Intermediate - Students learn algebraic notation, playing with a clock, an understanding of strategies for opening a chess game, major tactical techniques, and basic endgame theory.

Advanced - Students develop advanced competitive strategies including the an opening repertoire, positional strategies, tactical combinations, endgame play, and methods of applying sport psychology to their games.

All students gain knowledge of chess history, chess news, and grow their appreciation of chess. Students are encouraged to play in regional tournaments for individual and team awards.
